



Mithran from Grade 3A has made us proud by achieving the Best Player Award in the Madurai District Football Association event organized by th MDFA Academics Committee.






Mindful Moments





"Postal services bring people closer, transcending borders." "We're proud to instill appreciation for postal services in our learners. May this legacy continue to unite us globally."





TIPS learners enthusiastically celebrated Gandhi Jayanti, honoring the birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi, the Father of the Nation.



It's these small, cherished moments—the laughter shared with friends, the encouragement from teachers, and the satisfaction of mastering something new, that make the classroom experience unforgettable.





Timeline Activity made students inquire and explore about India's Struggle for Independence.
